Review Area	Statement
Timetable Provision for Physical Education	Every pupil in the school receives a minimum of one hour timetabled PE per week
School PE plan	The school has a comprehensive and up to date PE plan
Primary PE Curriculum	The school follows the Primary PE Curriculum teaching a minimum of 5 of the strands to every class every year
Discretionary Time	The school makes use of discretionary time to enhance the PE programme and provide increased physical activity opportunities for the pupils
Extracurricular Activities	The school makes a range of extracurricular activities available to pupils on an individual and team basis in the school
Inclusive Physical Activity	The school's extracurricular programme is inclusive. It caters for the diversity of pupils including those with special needs
Activity during Break Times	The school takes steps to help promote physical activity during lunch and break times
Active Travel to and from School	The school encourages pupils to walk or cycle to school where it is safe to do so
National Governing Bodies, Local Sports Partnerships and the HSE	The school seeks the assistance of outside agencies such as the Local Sports Partnerships, National Governing Bodies and the HSE to help promote physical activity
Links with the Community	The school works with parents and the local community to promote physical activity
Active School Week	The school organises an Active School Week each year
Pupil Voice	The school involves pupils in the decision making process in relation to the provision and promotion of physical activity
Celebrating Physical Activity Skills and Achievements	The school offers pupils the opportunity to celebrate their physical activity skills and achievements
Professional Development	The school encourages staff to attend in-service courses in the areas of PE, physical activity and sport
Resources	The school has adequate equipment to provide pupils with comprehensive PE, physical activity and sports programmes
